Our main goals:

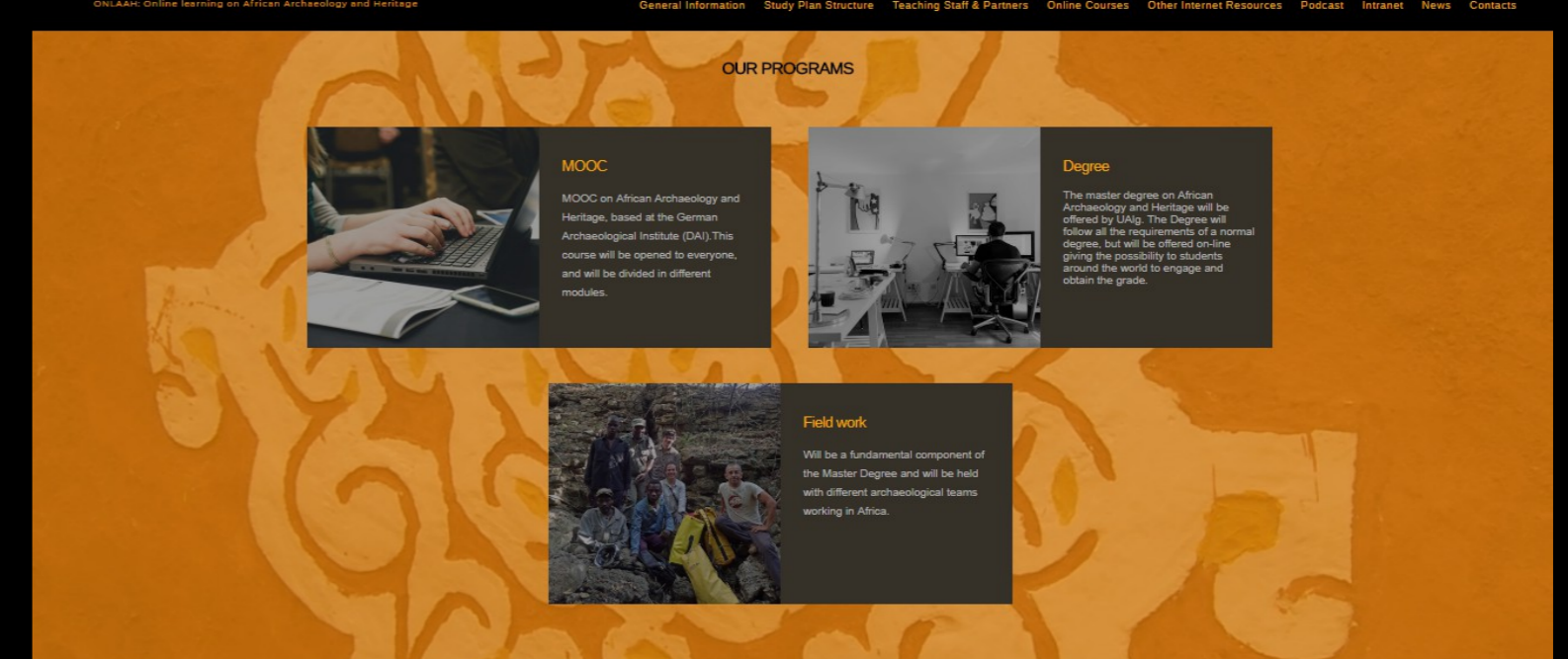
- Offer the first online courses on African archaeology and heritage accessible worldwide.
